WORDS FROM WANG

"Are You Ready for an Advent-ure?"

The word *advent* comes from the Latin term, *adventus*, meaning "pending arrival" or "coming," particularly the coming of something having great importance. Advent as a season is both a time of joy-filled, anticipatory celebration of the arrival of Jesus Christ but actually includes the practices of repentance, meditation, and penance. Some call it a "mini-Lent," just without the fasting. Quite the opposite, as a matter of fact, right? Add one letter to fast and it's a feast. But I digress. So many of us look forward, with great anticipation, to those wonderful gatherings of feasting and merriment in what many have dubbed "the most wonderful time of the year."

But wait...there's more. The operative word here being "wait." "Why wait," says our counter culture that has been playing Christmas music since the day after Halloween and has had those giant inflatables in their yards before even removing the fallen leaves. Again, the operative word is "wait."

Merriam-Webster defines the word *wait* as: *to stay in place in expectation of; to delay serving, as in a meal* (why, there's even a "wait" staff at restaurants). *It also means to remain stationary in readiness or expectation; to look forward to and hold back expectantly.* All of this is saying that celebrating the birth of Christ is not something intended to happen quickly. Nor is it designed to be an extension of the Thanksgiving holiday (thanks to the retail world's invention of Black Friday).

To be blunt, it took hundreds of years for the long-awaited Messiah to appear to those who longed for the event to occur, so the least we can do is to honor our forebears by "waiting" for the Christmas holiday to begin. Countless biblical writers in the Old Testament share the stories of those who sacrificed so much and who committed their faithful living to prepare for the new day that we associate with the birth of Christ. They waited for a very, very long time. *The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.* (Jeremiah 33:14-15)

So, you see, waiting is part of the plan, and it can truly enhance our spiritual growth and development as Christians. And waiting can truly expand our understanding of God's will for us - and should therefore be reflected in the ways that we *prepare the way*. So, do yourselves a favor. Don't rush Christmas. Take the time necessary to prepare your bodies, your minds, and your spirits. It's worth the wait, and yes, the long journey is all part of the ancient customs passed down to us. Are you ready for the "Advent-ure"??

Clearly, it was on the mind of God and I truly want to thank God for the people and the place that helped to nurture and shape me into the pastor that I am - but to then bring it back home and to allow me the opportunity to preach and lead as a veteran minister in the prime of his life (so to speak).

It has been a privilege and pleasure to serve among you these past fifteen months as your interim pastor. I have enjoyed making new acquaintances and learning from so many of you. But I must confess that what has made our time together so much more meaningful is having been able to reconnect and get reacquainted with some of the most loving and faithful people that I have ever had the opportunity to know. It reminds me of the cute little camp song that we used to sing: *make new friends and keep the old; one is silver and the other gold.*

I still remember a sermon that the Rev. Gary Miller preached when he and I served together. He stood in the middle of the aisle and asked, “if these walls could speak, what might they be saying?” And he proceeded to name some of the saints of old that had worshipped and served in this church; the ones whose shoulders so many others had stood on as they carried the torch of discipleship. In the 30+ years since then, that great cloud of witnesses has grown, some of whom I actually remember having known and whom I most certainly admired. And now, so many of you have honored their legacies by sustaining the ministries of this church. But coming back here and being able to witness your actions as you have followed in their footsteps has truly been a blessing.

So, to my “new” friends, I will now say “goodbye” and thank you for the new memories. But (and this is the hard part) to my “golden” friends, it’s time to “goodbye again.” What else can I say? Well, I could say thank you for loving me and supporting me in the beginning; but then, thank you for allowing me the opportunity to do it all over again; and to rekindle those eternal bonds of friendship, to care and to share again, and to walk together in this crazy path of living by faith. And now, with a grateful heart, I bid you adieu. And may God’s richest blessings be upon each and every one of you this day and forevermore. PBob


SENIOR AFTERNOON OF GAMES

VOLUNTEER ON THE PRAIRIE TRAIL!

The last 2025 clean-up will be Saturday, December 13 from 9:00- 11:00am. Join the McHenry County Conservation Foundation to help maintain a small segment of our extensive county trail system! As part of the District's Adopt-A-Trail program, once a month from April through December, McHenry County Conservation Foundation volunteers and staff will meet at the Mitchard Way (formerly Meyer Rd) parking lot in Algonquin to help keep a one-mile stretch of the trail free of debris and litter. Take a morning stroll down the Prairie Trail, meet new people, and help beautify the area. Dress for the weather. Gloves and hand sanitizer are encouraged. Long-handled trash pickers provided. The minimum age to volunteer independently is 18, but those under 18 can sign up with adult supervision.
